Population grew by 15,636 over the last 5 years and is projected to grow by 39,767 over the next 5 years.

Jobs decreased by 5,084 over the last 5 years but are projected to grow by 35,907 over the next 5 years.

Regional average earnings per job are **\$18.9K below** the national average earnings of \$79.8K per job.

Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 0.9% since 2017, growing by 15,636. Population is expected to increase by 2.2% between 2022 and 2027, adding 39,767.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs declined by 0.6% in PSO-Served Oklahoma Counties from 790,253 to 785,169. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 2.4% by 3.0%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 60.2% to 60.2% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **16.6% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (4.2% below the national average), and **8.9% hold an Associate's Degree** (the same as the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.






Unemployment by Gender




Unemployment by Race

Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends










Retiring Soon







Inbound and Outbound Migration

The table below analyzes past and current residents of PSO-Served Oklahoma Counties. The left column shows residents of other counties migrating to PSO-Served Oklahoma Counties. The right column shows residents migrating from PSO-Served Oklahoma Counties to other counties.

As of 2020, 4,111 people have migrated from Oklahoma County, OK to PSO-Served Oklahoma Counties. In the same year, 4,234 people left PSO-Served Oklahoma Counties migrating to Oklahoma County, OK. The total Net Migration for PSO-Served Oklahoma Counties in 2020 was 8,431.








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Location Quotient






Top Industry GRP










Educational Pipeline
